At INNOVATE, MERLOT contributed its leadership to the Community College Summit, where over 100 participants joined workshops on Affordable Learning Solutions (<u>http://als.skillscommons.org</u>), storytelling

(<u>http://support.skillscommons.or/connect/storytelling</u>) and the open courseware to help industry experts become expert instructors. MERLOT also provided leadership for the HBCU Affordability Summit and you can read more about that project in an article presented below in this newsletter. The INNOVATE Conference is our time to showcase the improvements to MERLOT – like the completely redesigned user interface and technical infrastructure – and to build new relationships with members of the MERLOT community.

What's ahead for MERLOT? The workforce development arm of the CSU-MERLOT program – SkillsCommons – will be focusing on acquiring grants and partners to sustain the growth and use of workforce OER. reserved as MERLOT's highest honor. The recipient of this award exemplifies the vision that brings MERLOT members together to create the MERLOT Community. Individuals who receive this award have made many personal contributions to MERLOT and have demonstrated their dedication to MERLOT through serving as visionaries and leaders. The recipients are selected by the previous



winners from the past five years. This year's recipient is Angela Gunder, the Director of Instructional Design and Curriculum Development at The University of Arizona. Angela is an Associate Editor on the Teacher Education Board. She was instrumental in revising the Discipline Portals and has been a Peer Reviewer Extraordinaire since her first year with MERLOT in 2013. Angela was the recipient of the Innovative Use of MERLOT Award in 2017. She is co-founder of the Technology Test Kitchen and instrumental in the creation of the Innovation Labs at the Innovate Conference. Angela served as co-chair of this year's Innovate Conference.

The MERLOT Business Editorial Board selected Dr. Hofacker's free online textbook, designed for Ph.D. students. "We wanted to recognize his unique contribution at this level."

The Faculty Development Classics Award was accepted by Dr. Lauren Scharff on behalf of Improve with Metacognition.

The MERLOT Faculty Development Editorial Board cited the goal of the site was to highlight and focus on how metacognition plays a key role in the process of learning and teaching academic content and developing skills in higher education.



The ICT Literacy Classics Award was awarded to Michael Caulfield for Web Literacy for Student Fact-Checkers.

Dr. Caulfield's site helps students to learn to evaluate web resources. He presented a workshop at Innovate 2018 highlighting his work.





The Psychology Classics Award was presented to Bob Heller for Positive Reinforcement: A Self-Instructional Exercise.

This site uses principles of behavior analysis to create a tutorial where students can gain practice in the discrimination of key features that operationally define the concept of positive reinforcement in psychology.

The Sociology Classics Award was presented to Nathan Palmer on behalf of Sociology in Focus.

<u>SociologyInFocus.com</u> is a website where current events, pop culture, or common everyday experiences are used as illustrative examples of a sociological concept or to highlight a sociological research finding



The Teacher Education Classics Award was presented to Joey Taralson representing



FlipGrid One.

FlipGrid One is a free video discussion platform. It provides a tool for educators and students to create videos that allow responses and interaction.

The World Languages Classics Award was awarded to Todd Bryant for The Mixxer Language Exchange.

The Mixxer is a free social networking language exchange site integrated with Skype and hosted at Dickinson College. Individuals can find language partners on their own as well as submit writing for feedback.



### **MERLOT House Cup**

The House Cup (modeled on the Harry Potter House Cup) is an award to recognize the level of contributions made to the MERLOT collection during the past academic year. Contributions include Reviews, Contributions to MERLOT, Assignments, Comments, and editor reviews. The top five editorial boards in alphabetical order were: **Biology**, **Business, Computer Science, Sociology** and **Teacher Education**.

This year's winner was the Teacher Education Board which made 697 contributions to MERLOT, including 175 individual reviews, and 106 composite reviews. The Teacher Education Board also won the House Cup in 2015.

# Feature Article – HBCU Summit

#### HBCU AFFORDABILITY SUMMIT AT INNOVATE 2018: A SUCCESS STORY by Moustapha Diack

The 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Historically Black Colleges and Universities **(HBCUs) Practitioners Summit for Advancing Affordable Learning Solutions and Quality Online Education** held this year in Nashville Tennessee as integral part of the OLC/MERLOT Innovate international conference was a success story, as would attest all practitioners who attended this year Summit.

The Affordability Summit kicked off with a one-day pre-conference workshop on April 17, 2018, hosted by Fisk University in Nashville, TN. The venue facilitated by Dr. Robbie Melton, Professor, TSU Technology Strategic Consultant and HBCU Summit co-chair, gathered more than 59 participants from different HBCU institutions. The excellent presentations and panels enabled participants to share practices, opportunities and challenges for successful integration of Open Education and affordable learning solutions (AL\$) at their institutions. The 2 and 1/2 - day Summit held on April 18 thru April 20, attracted more than 89 participants from various HBCU and African institutions. This 2nd annual meeting of HBCU's at INNOVATE enabled participating institutions to present and share their AL\$ strategies and outcomes, along with other online education initiatives that emerge as priorities for HBCU's. Dr. Michael Torrence, President of Motlow State Community College, who participated in the Summit noted: "The HBCU Summit proved positive in its mission to communicate the importance of Open Educational Resources (OER) as a viable option for postsecondary institutions. The Online Learning Consortium (OLC) provided a platform for Motlow State Community College to engage in meaningful dialogue with several HBCU's, learn about existing and growing OER databases, and further cost neutral impactful teaching and learning opportunities.

We could not have been more pleased to have participated and look to the future where the journey toward student success begins with every student having access to their materials on the first day of class."

According to Dr. Moustapha Diack, Southern University System (SUS) Vice President for Online Learning Services and HBCU Summit Chair, The HBCU Summit partnering institutions with support from the CSU/MERLOT organization are enabling an international research network focusing on measuring the effect of AL\$ on Student Recruitment Retention and Success (SRRS) at minority institutions. Indeed, after the 2<sup>nd</sup> HBCU Summit, Nashville 2018, there were a total of 20 HBCU institutions and Higher Education Institutions in Africa (HEIA) who expressed interest in joining the network. 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# Update on MERLOT Community

### **Become a MERLOT Peer Reviewer and GRAPE Camp Information**

To become a Peer Reviewer for MERLOT, individuals should be an instructor in an institution of higher education and have:

- Expertise in the scholarship of their field
- Excellence in teaching
- Experience in using technology in teaching and learning, and
- Connections to professional organizations in their discipline.

MERLOT has developed an orientation for Peer Reviewers to ensure that they become familiar with MERLOT processes and policies on Peer Review. MERLOT Management conducts GRAPE Camp (Getting Reviewers Accustomed to the Process of Evaluation) to assist Peer Reviewers on a regular basis. GRAPE Camp consists of a series of three onehour workshops online, one per week. In these webinars, participants will:

- Develop an understanding of MERLOT
- Learn how MERLOT evaluates Learning Materials
- Conduct a group review
- Complete an Individual Review

- Learn how to use the Workspace tool, and
- Introduce participants to the Editorial Board of their disciplines.

The webinar includes people from a variety of disciplines and is archived so participants can review the material as needed. For information about GRAPE Camp, contact <u>Cathy</u> <u>Swift</u>.

# **Meet the Editors**

# **Biology – Michael Plotkin and Martin Zahn**



Michael Plotkin ----I joined the Biology editorial board in 2010, after finding MERLOT purely by chance while scouring the web for resources. I contacted the editor, and was soon participating as a reviewer on the biology board. I very much enjoyed the work and the varied activities of the board and when the illustrious longstanding editor Jim Bidlack retired, Marty Zahn and I agreed (with some jitters on my part at least) to take over as co-editors. My trepidation notwithstanding, it has been non-stop adventure

and excitement ever since. In addition to winning the House Cup several years ago, we have revitalized our board to include a dedicated group of biologists of all sorts, from all over the country, and we have begun the process of revitalizing the curation of the materials. We restructured and modernized our material categories and are beginning to create content pages to highlight our best materials. We aim to promote easy access to the best open resources in biology available on the web, and in the process to make MERLOT the go-to site for educators. Since the day I joined, I have found MERLOT to be an exceptionally rewarding activity both for the service to the community of education professionals, and for the amazing interactions I have had with colleagues in MERLOT. In addition to working with MERLOT, I am a plant biologist with an interest in phylogeny, systematics, evolution, and the nature of science—in addition to science education, of course. I am an associate professor at Mt. San Jacinto College in Southern California (in the shadow of Mount San Jacinto). I also serve as the department chair of life sciences where I oversee biology, nutrition, environmental science, and health sciences.

Marty Zahn ---As best I can research and recollect, I was introduced to MERLOT in 2001 when the Virginia Community College System became a Partner in the project. I was one of the faculty selected and did my MERLOT peer reviewer training in Nashville that Fall. The entire project was relatively new but the Biology Editorial Team was an original group and headed up by Scott Cooper and Jeff Bell. I attended the MERLOT



International meetings for several years as well as presenting at those meetings. Virginia supported us for those activities. There came a change in administration at the VCCS about six years after starting and the VCCS withdrew as a Partner and all support was stopped. After a couple of years I stopped participating. Then, in 2010, I rejoined the editorial team and after a few years became co-editor. I have remained active since that

time but have not attended the annual meetings because my college does not support out of state travel for faculty.

# Meet the Board Member – Whitney Holden

Dr. Whitney Holden has been a member of the MERLOT Biology editorial board since August 2017 and achieved the status of Peer Reviewer Extraordinaire in March 2018. She received a B.S. in Biochemistry from the University of Arkansas in 2009,

where she was a Goldwater Scholar, and a Ph.D. in Microbiology & Immunology from Vanderbilt University in 2014, where she was a National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellow. Her dissertation research focused on immune defenses like antimicrobial peptides and symbiotic skin bacteria against the fungal pathogen Batrachochytrium dendrobatidis. Her research has been published in multiple academic journals including Science, Developmental & Comparative Immunology, Biological Conservation, and



Applied & Environmental Microbiology. Since the fall of 2014, she has been teaching Science of Biology, Microbiology, and Infectious Disease in History & Culture at the Arkansas School for Mathematics, Sciences, and the Arts. Dr. Holden also co-directs two major outreach programs: Advanced Biology Plus, which offers professional development and in-classroom support to AP Biology teachers from across the state of Arkansas, and the Arkansas Summer Research Institute, which provides training in essential research skills to undergraduates in STEM disciplines. In her spare time, she runs a successful YouTube channel for education in biology

(<u>www.youtube.com/BiologyProfessor</u>), teaches chemistry as an adjunct professor at National Park College, and tries to be part of cool conversations on Twitter (@DrWhitneyHolden).

Additionally, you can earn a registration at the Innovate conference by completing 15 reviews and submitting a minimum of five materials between April 1, 2018 and March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2019. Each month, I choose at random a reviewer's name who has completed reviews during the previous month. That reviewer earns a \$50 gift card from the e-retailer of his or her choice.
