In a recent <u>Campus Technology article</u>, MERLOT was called the "OER Mothership." How are we able to sustain this growth and innovation? It is because of your leadership and efforts that MERLOT continues to get better! Without our community, we'd just be another website. We have achieved this role in higher education because of YOU and the entire MERLOT Community! THANK YOU!

Affordable Learning Solutions — the use of OER, library, free, and low-cost resources for course materials has reached critical mass. Last year, the California State University saved over \$50 million for its students through its Affordable Learning Solutions program. MERLOT has been a foundational vehicle for many institution's Affordable Learning Solutions initiatives, including the HBCUs (Historically Black Colleges and Universities). MERLOT has created a portal for the 104 HBCUs as well as individual portals for early adopting campuses (www.hbcuals.org). MERLOT's "sister" program SkillsCommons (www.skillscommons.org) has expanded the collection of OER in workforce development and now has had over 2,000,000 downloads of materials from the SkillsCommons collection. SkillCommons recently won the 2019 Teaching and Learning Impact Award (Campus Technology) as well.

On a personal note, I'd like to share with you that I have returned to the Cal State University Long Beach campus and will be continuing as the Executive Director of MERLOT within my role as a CSU Long Beach faculty. We have many projects underway and we'll be continuing to move forward in innovative ways. I look forward to seeing many of you at the OLC-MERLOT INNOVATE Conference in Chicago 2020.

MERLOT created the Peer Reviewer Extraordinaire award to honor the hard work and generous donation of our members' time, energy and enthusiasm that they direct towards the growth and development of MERLOT. We rely heavily on our Peer Reviewers to help expand the MERLOT collection and perform the Peer Review process. Again this year MERLOT reviewers have the opportunity to earn free registration (either in-person or virtual) at the Innovate Conference at the Sheraton - Chicago, March 31-April 3, 2020. Awardees also receive certificates of merit and letters of appreciation sent to their deans and/or department chairs. In order to participate, you must have completed MERLOT GRAPE (Getting Reviewers Accustomed to the Process of Evaluation) Camp, complete 15 reviews that have been accepted by your editor and submit a minimum of five materials to the collection between March 16, 2019 and March 15, 2020. 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

You've been hearing about the new MERLOT Content Builder for months and we hope that many of you have been using the beta version. We are in our final stages of testing and getting ready to release the much anticipated new version! Content Builder was originally built and supported by the Carnegie Foundation and about 10 years ago, MERLOT adopted and integrated it. Over time the functionality was refined but the latest release will have a completely new user interface for an even easier user experience. You will see a new tool that is more intuitive, especially allowing users to collaborate with other MERLOT members and colleagues. More about collaborating in the next Vineyard. Update on MERLOT Community

Fall GRAPE Camp Sessions

To become a Peer Reviewer for MERLOT, individuals should be an instructor in an institution of higher education and have:

- Expertise in the scholarship of their field
- Excellence in teaching, with a few exceptions
- Experience in using technology in teaching and learning, and
- Connections to professional organizations in their discipline.

MERLOT has developed an orientation for Peer Reviewers to ensure that they become familiar with MERLOT processes and policies on Peer Review. MERLOT Management conducts GRAPE Camp (Getting Reviewers Accustomed to the Process of Evaluation) to assist Peer Reviewers on a regular basis. GRAPE Camp consists of a series of three one-hour workshops online, one per week. In these webinars, participants will:

- Develop an understanding of MERLOT
- Learn how MERLOT evaluates Learning Materials
- Conduct a group review
- Complete an Individual Review
- Learn how to use the Workspace tool, and
- Introduce participants to the Editorial Board of their disciplines.

The webinar includes people from a variety of disciplines and is archived so participants can review the material as needed. For information about GRAPE Camp, contact Cathy Swift (cswift@calstate.edu).

Meet the Editor – Edmundo Tovar, Information Technology



Edmundo Tovar received the computer engineering degree and Ph.D. degree in Informatics from the Madrid Technical University (Universidad Politécnica de Madrid, UPM), Madrid, Spain, in 1986 and 1994, respectively. He is currently (2001-) with

the UPM as a Professor of Information Technology in Enterprise with the Languages and Information Systems Department. He is a Certified Software Development Professional (CSDP) (2005 -) and Professional Software Engineering Master Certification (2015-) of the IEEE Computer Society. He has been a member at large of the IEEE Education Society Board of Governors (2005–2013), Vice President of Educational Activities and Awards (2013–2018), and President Elect (2019-2020) and President (2021-2022).

Edmundo has become aware for more than 10 years of the impact of open education to address current and needs education needs occupying several positions. He has served as an elected member of the Board of Directors of the Open Education Consortium (2009–2013), Executive Director of the OCW Office of the UPM (2008–2012), and Executive Director of the Open Education Office at UPM (2013-2016). He leads an Innovation Group in technologies applied to Open Education, currently coordinating an European Consortium of institutions under the EntreCom4ALL 2017-1-ES01-KA202-038383 project, adapting the European EntreComp framework to different target groups as women and youth entrepreneurs http://entrecom4all.eu. He is committed to the use of OER repositories, and in particular as Editor of the Information Technology / Information Systems Editorial Board of MERLOT, he promotes a living community sharing and enriching high quality OER as much as the development of open educational practices.

Meet the Board Member – Leila Halawi

Dr. Leila Halawi is a tenured associate professor with the College of



Aeronautics, department of Graduate Studies, Worldwide Campus. Dr. Halawi served as the MMIS Program Chair, MIS Discipline Chair, Chair of the Research Committee for the Senate and the Director of Research for the College of Business. She developed the MMIS curriculum

in addition to the content of most of the courses within the program. She also started Alliances with SAS®, Tableau and Microsoft. The Partnership with SAS resulted in a joint certificate for the Business Intelligence and

Analytics specialization. She holds a Certification by Sloan C Consortium in Online Teaching, and a certificate from Quality Matters on Applying the QM Rubrics, (APPQMR).

She is an advisory board member and a reviewer for the Enterprise Architecture Body of Knowledge (EABOK), Mitre Corporation. She is a Reviewer for the Journal of Computer Information Systems (JCIS) and the International Association for computer information systems (IACIS). She is also a program committee member and reviewer for the European Conference on Social Media, (ECSM), the European Conference on Knowledge Management (ECKM) and the International Conference on Intellectual Capital and Knowledge Management (ICIKM), the Federated Conference on computer science and information systems (FEDCSIS). She is also part of the IT editorial board of the multimedia educational resource for learning and online teaching (MERLOT).

She co-authored this book: Applying Predictive Analytics Finding Value in Data Published by Springer, 2019. Her research has been published in the Journal of Computer Information Systems (JCIS), the Learning Organization Journal, the Journal of Business Education, the Electronic Journal of Knowledge Management (EJKM), the Academy of Information and Management Sciences Journal (AIMSJ), Journal of International Technology and Information Management, Journal of Education for Business, Academy of Healthcare Management Journal (AHCMJ) among others. She is frequently invited to present her research at national and international conferences.

Her current research interests include knowledge management, Business Intelligence, information systems success and strategy, and ethical impacts of information technology, promoting innovation, curriculum development and design, enterprise architecture and systems, big data and predictive analytics. Her current research focus on develop a curriculum (DACUM), a semi-structured curriculum design concept that uses subject matter experts who understand industry needs as the basis of curriculum design. The purpose of this research is to strengthen the research effort focused on bridging the gap between industry needs for an IT/IS/MIS workforce and university curricula. The ultimate goal is to begin the discussion on the importance of creating an industry-ready workforce by designing an industry-relevant IT/IS/MIS curriculum and encouraging the flow of information between industry and academia so academia can best serve its students and prepare them for industry.

Dr. Halawi lives in Clearwater, Florida and enjoys traveling, swimming, publishing, and attending national and international conferences.



Out and About with MERLOT

Cris Guenter, Professor Emerita and MERLOT Teacher Education Editorial Board member, is serving as a CSU, Chico member of the North State Arts Education Consortium (NSAEC) launched by Butte County in California. NSAEC received a 2.8 million dollar grant from the California Department of Education for student support and academic enrichment in 2019.NSAEC is focusing on funding arts infrastructure and teacher professional development on behalf of K-12 schools in over 60 districts and county offices of education in Northern California. For teachers participating in the consortium, the grant provides professional development to build their capacity to provide high quality arts education for their students.
