Help Teaching and Learning Online: The COVID pandemic has affected the lives of billions of people and the education of so many people has been transformed. People of all ages and all walks of life are now learning online because there are no other options. MERLOT and SkillsCommons have designed an OER portal for some free and open educational resources that you can immediately use to support online learning for both teachers and learners: "Preparing to Teach and Learn Online". The website was built in MERLOT Content Builder so MERLOT members can rebrand and customize a copy of the website for their institution or community. EXPLORE New Partnerships to Support Affordable Learning: Partnerships have been essential to provide educators and learners more complete solutions to their teaching learning challenges. The 11 year partnership with the Online Learning Consortium has resulted in new collaborative projects, including a <u>virtual IDEATE conference on teaching STEM Labs online</u>. You can explore the resources and videos as well as the <u>MERLOT-SkillsCommons Virtual Labs portal</u>. We have also contributed to <u>OLC's IDEATE virtual conference on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion</u> in Digital Learning Environments.

We are partnering with the ASEAN University Network-TEPL, China's XJTU University' Learning Mall, the Commonwealth of Learning's Open Doors program, and the National Skills Development Corporation of India to provide open educational services and resources to people around the world. Our new collaboration with Pandemic Professors includes providing the organization a customized MERLOT-SkillsCommons portal that their tutors and students can use to support programs for low-income students impacted by the COVID 19 pandemic.

Our group of partners are helping us provide faculty and students powerful platform for customizing and delivering OER. Our new partnership with ecoText and our long-standing partnership with SoftChalk have helped us provide this service. Peer Reviewers Extraordinaire 2021 Program at INNOVATE

MERLOT created the Peer Reviewer Extraordinaire award to honor the hard work and generous donation of our members' time, energy and enthusiasm that they direct towards the growth and development of MERLOT. We rely heavily on our Peer Reviewers to help expand the MERLOT collection and create peer reviews.

MERLOT peer reviewers have the opportunity to earn free registration for the 2021 Innovate conference (all virtual). Awardees also receive certificates of merit and be named at the awards ceremony. In order to participate, reviewers must have completed MERLOT GRAPE (Getting Reviewers Accustomed to the Process of Evaluation) Camp, complete 15 reviews that have been accepted by your editor, and submit a minimum of 5 materials to the collection between March 16, 2020 and March 1, 2021.

By the end of December, three editors have achieved PRE status: Nancyruth Leibold, Health Sciences; Lesley Farmer, ICT Literacy; and Larry Green, Mathematics and Statistics.

Participate in Research: Remixing OER

Remix, defined as the objects, processes and mindsets developed through the act of combining or manipulating digital materials to create something new (Wiley, n.d.; Lessig, 2004; Knobel & Lankshear, 2008; Hilton et al., 2010), serves as a prominent practice for open educators, particularly those engaged in networked communities like MERLOT. Currently, though, there is a need for a better understanding of how open educational practices (OEP) such as remix are used to promote open pedagogy, and how in turn, issues of power and privilege can limit openness regardless of the intentions of open educators engaging in OEP.

Angela Gunder, a member of the MERLOT Teacher Education Editorial Board and the Chief Academic Officer of the Online Learning Consortium, is conducting a research study as part of her dissertation for her Ph.D. from The University of Arizona. Angela shares, "As the global conversation around open education turns to situating openness as a fundamental measure to support sustained access to education for all learners, this study will help communities in the process of determining how organizations, institutions, and countries will embed open educational practices such as remix into the framework of their teaching and learning practices." "Inclusiveness requires openness to remixing social, cultural, economic, historical, and other contextualizations to the content being taught, "says Gerry Hanley, Executive Director of MERLOT and SkillsCommons. "If we are to become more inclusive in education for all, understanding how to facilitate remixing as an open educational practice is critical."

Angela is looking for participants for her study and is hopeful that the members of the MERLOT community will be willing to take a little time (20-30 minutes) to complete her survey on the practices and perspectives of educators on the remix of open educational resources (OER). She is particularly looking for educators to contribute who are not in the U.S. or Canada, though all are welcome to do the survey.






Adobe no Longer Supporting Flash Content



Members may be aware that a number of resources linked in MERLOT were created using Adobe Flash technology. These resources require the use of the Flash Player browser plug-in to work. Earlier this month Adobe dropped support for Flash Player and they recommend that users uninstall the browser plugin for security reasons.

The MERLOT team is working to identify all of the effected resources linked in the repository. Once a resource is identified as being Flash-based, we will attempt to find a replacement resource and if a replacement exists, we will update the MERLOT record with the new link. However, in some cases where no replacement can be found, the record will be deleted.

If you encounter a MERLOT resource that is no longer available or functional, for any reason, you can help us by clicking the "Report Broken Link" option in the record. This will bring it to our attention, and we will do our best to fix the link or find a replacement.

Update on MERLOT Community

Become a MERLOT Peer Reviewer and GRAPE Camp Information

To become a Peer Reviewer for MERLOT, individuals should be an instructor in an institution of higher education and have:

- Expertise in the scholarship of their field
- Excellence in teaching, with a few exceptions
- Experience in using technology in teaching and learning, and
- Connections to professional organizations in their discipline

MERLOT has developed an orientation for Peer Reviewers to ensure that they become familiar with MERLOT processes and policies on Peer Review. MERLOT Management conducts GRAPE Camp (Getting Reviewers Accustomed to the Process of Evaluation) to assist Peer Reviewers on a regular basis. GRAPE Camp consists of a series of three one-hour workshops online, one per week. In these webinars, participants will:

- Develop an understanding of MERLOT
- Learn how MERLOT evaluates Learning Materials
- Conduct a group review
- Complete an Individual Review
- Learn how to use the Workspace tool
- Introduce participants to the editorial board in their discipline.

The webinar includes people from a variety of disciplines and is archived so participants can review the material as needed. For information about GRAPE Camp, contact Cathy Swift.
