In the U.S. and with the essential support from the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, our partnership with Tennessee State University is producing significant Affordable Learning Solutions in about 25 Historically Black Colleges and Universities. Our SkillsCommons program continues to support the Lorain County Community College's grant in using OER to deliver workforce development training in manufacturing.

We have a number of new projects you'll learn more about in the feature articles below and at the upcoming OLC-MERLOT INNOVATE 2022 Conference in March and April. The MERLOT Community will gather both virtually (March 28- April 1) and face-to-face (April 11-14 in Dallas TX). We are looking forward to seeing you and supporting you as you continue to find ways to teach with compassion during these challenging times.

INNOVATE 2022 Conference

This spring, the Innovate 2022 Conference will welcome thousands of educators and innovators to contribute to shaping the future of online, digital, and blended learning. As a joint conference presented by the Online Learning Consortium (OLC) and MERLOT, Innovate 2022 will be held virtually March 28 - April 1, 2022 and onsite in Dallas, TX, April 11 - 14, 2022.

Ahead of the conference, the OLC is also convening its first Leadership Network Symposium in Dallas, TX, on April 11. But unless we commit to sharing our best practices and lessons learned, we won't be able to make the strides that we need to."

With one-of-a-kind onsite and fully-online offerings, the blended OLC Innovate experience offers flexible pathways to challenge teaching and learning paradigms, reimagine the learning experience, and ideate on how disruptions in education today will shape the innovative classroom of tomorrow.

The widespread usefulness and significant value of the open educational resources created by the project would directly benefit the MERLOT Engineering community as well others, including the MERLOT Teacher Education community.

The objectives are clearly defined and well aligned with the priorities and strategic development of MERLOT. There is a good project management plan to achieve these objectives.

The multi-language scope of the project has the potential for international impact when it is coupled with providing open access to the resources.

Upcoming Webinar Series Explores Open Educational Resources

In collaboration with the Online Learning Consortium (OLC), Bay View Analytics is researching the factors impacting the growth of awareness, adoption, and effective use of Open Educational Resources (OER).

This project aims to provide educators (in K-12 and higher education) and their academic institutions with essential data to make informed strategic and operational decisions related to Open Educational Resources. <u>Upcoming webinars include</u>:

March 8, 2022: It's easy to grow OER adoption

Faculty members who are aware of an OER initiative are 300%+ more likely to adopt OER than the general faculty population. This webinar examines the data behind this finding and introduces several individuals who have made this difference a reality. Attendees will leave with an understanding of successful strategies and the next steps they can apply at their institution.

March 15, 2022: How is the pandemic affecting the future of OER?

Multiple surveys of students, faculty, and administrators have shown that the pandemic is producing fundamental changes in teaching and learning across all higher education. Many of these changes bode well for the future growth of OER adoption, while others will act against growth. Which of these competing pressures will prevail?

March 30, 2022: The Three Projected Futures for Open Educational Resources*

*Will be presented as a virtual session at OLC Innovate 2022

What is the future for Open Educational Resources (OER) in higher education? This presentation examines three different scenarios, noting how the future trajectory for OER has been changed: first by actions of the commercial publishers and most recently by the global COVID-19 pandemic.





Upcoming Webinar Series Explores Open Educational Resources (continued)

Times of change are also times of opportunity. Funded by a three-year grant from the William and Flora Hewlett Foundation, the project will explore the changing role of OER in both U.S. K-12 and higher education, including questions such as: How should OER be positioned in the pandemic and post-pandemic educational universe? Will the same factors that drove awareness and adoption before the pandemic still work? How should OER take advantage of new realities?

The project builds on over a decade of previous research by Bay View Analytics (all reports are provided without cost under a Creative Commons license). The most recent reports include:

- A Year Apart: Adapting Curricula for a Pandemic, U.S. K-12 Education, 2021
- <u>Infographic: A Year Apart: Adapting Curricula for a Pandemic</u>
- Digital Texts in the Time of COVID: U.S. Higher Education, 2020
- The Impact of OER Initiatives on Faculty Selection of Classroom Materials

Results will be presented in a series of free OLC-Bay View Analytics webinars, presented at the upcoming OLC Innovate conference, and published annual research reports, infographics, and short papers, all available on the Bay View Analytics website.

The RISE Program at Carlton College

Our Teaching and Learning Corner (TLC) team, Laura Perry, Erin Blauvelt, and myself were awarded the 2021 USDLA Excellence in Teaching Award for creating and teaching our workshop, Reframing Instruction for Success Everywhere (RISE) to advance faculty workforce development during the COVID pandemic. This is the third award received this year to honor the Teaching and Learning Corner and the RISE workforce development initiative. Earlier awards include the 2021 OLC Effective Practice awarded by the Online Learning Consortium and 2021 Phalanx Distinguished Service Award awarded by Phalanx, Clarkson's highest honorary society.

We did a segment for OER focused on MERLOT during the Module on Creating Content. Module 3 in our workshop is entitled Content Delivery. For this topic, in the Module Overview we explain to faculty how students need to engage with and absorb concepts through a variety of types of materials that are both created by them and created by others. We first have them watch a

short video explaining the concept of Open Educational Resources (OER), and then we use an interactive video to guide them through the process of finding OER they can use to engage students by searching MERLOT to locate content, starting with the Smart Search option and then providing examples of how MERLOT can also be used to search other OER digital libraries and demonstrating some of the engaging and often interactive content they will find.

Finally, the OER segment wraps up with faculty asked to search for and contribute a resource to the Collaborative OER Review Spreadsheet. We suggest they find a resource that would be useful in their class and then add it to the sheet to share with their particular school or department, On that sheet, they add comments about the pros and cons of the resource and optionally have the opportunity to ask questions about other contributions. Finally, we have them add the link to the resource to their Moodle course as a reminder for them to consider OER for content delivery and more.



MERLOT Partnerships

MERLOT and Partner in Publishing Innovation Projects



Over the years, MERLOT has worked with a variety of commercial partners as part of our Affordable Learning Solutions Initiative. Over the 2021 summer, we launched an Innovation Project with Partner in Publishing who has for many years helped bridge the gaps between commercial and academic perspectives on academic technology.

Partner in Publishing reached out to MERLOT to work on a number of programs:

- Uversity is building a collection of faculty authored, faculty copyrighted, faculty control supplemental learning materials such as study guides, lecture notes, practice exams that would be offered to students at an affordable cost.
- Honor Shield is providing faculty with free tools to control students cheating during their exam periods.
- XanEdu is providing user-friendly tools to enable faculty to organize, curate, and customize their own collections of OER and publisher resources to create affordable learning solutions.

MERLOT and SkillsCommons will continue to explore and collaborate on Innovation Projects with Partner in Publishing and will be reaching out to you. If you have an interest in participating in these projects, we will welcome you and your feedback on how to do it all better.

MERLOT, SkillsCommons, and H5P



MERLOT and SkillsCommons have partnered with H5P to provide awareness of the user-friendly application that can add and integrate interactives learning experiences into OER. Having just launched our in-kind collaboration, we will be working together on collaborative projects in Africa and India, led by our long-time program director in Africa, Moustapha Diack. Working with Dr. Diack's Digital Education Consulting group, MERLOT will help the adoption and enhancements of free and open educational resourses in Senegal. We will also be adding "H5P Interactives" to the MERLOT library features so

people can find these engaging resources easily in MERLOT. Explore the MERLOT-SkillsCommons H5P Initiative in our Open Educational Practices portal

MERLOT and Unversite' Numerique



Led by our Program Director for the MERLOT Africa Network, Moustapha Diack, we will be launching a program with the Unversite' Numerique (France) to build a French language OER collection and open educational practices for Francophone Africa. The development of multilingual OER collections is essential if we are truly going to open learning for all.

MERLOT and ecoText



MERLOT and ecoText partnered this past year to bring faculty and students an affordable learning solution for revising and remixing Open Textbooks. We empower faculty and students to open the pedagogy in the course, diversifying the perspectives present in class

materials. Not only can you integrate MERLOT resources into an ecoText easily but the ecoText collection is now part of MERLOT's "Other Libraries" search.

MERLOT and Nearpod



MERLOT and Nearpod are launching a collaboration to provide educators easy to use tools that for educators to revise and remix OER into customized curriculum that meet their students needs. Nearpod will be receiving a MERLOT "Classics" award from Teacher Education for its outstanding quality- CONGRATS to Nearpod! We will be working with NearPod

to provide a FREE trial offer for using this affordable platform. We'll be sending out invitations for you to request your FREE trial offer. We are planning free webinars about using Nearpod to integrate OER and create a learner-friendly experience.

Update on MERLOT Community

Become a MERLOT Peer Reviewer and GRAPE Camp Information

To become a Peer Reviewer for MERLOT, individuals should be an instructor in an institution of higher education and have:

- Expertise in the scholarship of their field
- Excellence in teaching, with a few exceptions
- Experience in using technology in teaching and learning, and
- Connections to professional organizations in their discipline

MERLOT has developed an orientation for Peer Reviewers to ensure that they become familiar with MERLOT processes and policies on Peer Review. MERLOT Management conducts GRAPE Camp (Getting Reviewers Accustomed to the Process of Evaluation) to assist Peer Reviewers on a regular basis. GRAPE Camp consists of a series of three one-hour workshops online, one per week. In these webinars, participants will:

- Develop an understanding of MERLOT
- Learn how MERLOT evaluates Learning Materials
- Conduct a group review
- Complete an Individual Review
- Learn how to use the Workspace tool
- Introduce participants to the editorial board in their discipline.

The webinar includes people from a variety of disciplines and is archived so participants can review the material as needed. For information about GRAPE Camp, contact Cathy Swift.
